MRS. B. A. HENRY ANNOUNCES PLANS FOR POPPY DAY

Poppy Day will be observed in Selma and throughout the nation on May 25, the Saturday before Memorial Day, Mrs. C. A. Bailey, president of Selma Post of the American Legion Auxiliary, announced today. On that day all Americans will be asked to wear memorial poppies in tribute to the World War dead and to aid the living victims of the war.

The little red memorial flowers will be distributed here by women and girls of the Selma Unit, under the direction of Mrs. B. A. Henry, chairman of the Poppy Day committee. All contributions received for the poppies will go to Legion and Auxiliary welfare work for the disabled veterans, their families and the families of the dead.

"We feel that Poppy Day will have increased meaning to America this year," said Mrs. C. A. Bailey, "because renewed warfare in Europe has renewed the memory of those still remember and honor their sacrifices. It is the flower which grew where they fell and which now bloom on the coats of Americans who appreciate their service.

"Events of the past year have shown us clearly that to be secure the United States must have men ready and able to defend the country, willing to give their lives in its defense, if necessary. We can be thankful today that we had such men twenty-two years ago. From them we can draw inspiration for the patriotic service necessary to maintain our freedom and democracy against today's dangers.
