Welfare-Public Safety, Hon. Z. J. Carey, Jr., Chairman of Commission - Government Employment Policies, Carribean Commission, Hon. B. Cyrus on Government Contracts, Dr. James Nabrit and others.

A message from President Dwight D. Eisenhower showed that he too was mindful of the fact that an influential group was in session at our Convention.

Business sessions included reports from the Treasurer, Executive Secretary, President and other officers who gave an account of their stewardship since the last Convention. An attempt to revise the Constitution provoked much discussion but the time element left the task incomplete.

Reports for activities in different states compared favorably with our own though in many cases things were done on a larger scale or there were opportunities for more concerted action on the part of club ladies. We are not to be ashamed but proud of our State Federation of Negro Women's Clubs.

Not until election time were we assured of our status in the National. Attempts to place the money allotted for our representation were not accepted until a checking for registered voters at election time. We soon found out with effort that we were allowed two votes and cast them where we thought best. At any rate we are assured good standing at present in the organization. We feel a great need for stronger representation in order that we might help put people we desire into offices. From election returns the following are officers: President, Mrs. Rosa Gregg; Vice President, Mrs. Dolly Alexander; Recording Secretary, Mrs. S. Wright; 2nd Recording Secretary, Miss J. Per-teet; 3rd Recording Secretary, Mrs. S. Simmons; Treasurer, Mrs. Inez Tinsley; Parliamentarian, Mrs. Etta Jackson; Chaplain, Rev. Eulah Smith; Historian, Mrs. Mable Neeler; Chairman of Executive Board, Mrs. L. Goff; Secretary of Executive Board, Mrs. D. Murrell. The next Convention will be held in New York in 1960. Plan now to attend in order to increase North Carolina's delegation.
