Scrap Book Suggestions

1. Size — Between 9x11 and 12x16 inches
2. Strong: Medium or heavy weight mounting paper, for pages
3. Loose leaf type where pages can be added or changed as needed.
4. Some general table of contents or index
5. Suggested fasteners:
 - a. leather strips
 - b. waxed cord
 - c. screws
 - d. metal clamps, etc.
6. Cover of strong, hard material as: wood, binders board (with or without cloth covering), pressboard, etc.
7. Originality, neatness, range of coverage and educational value should be kept in mind.
8. Pages need to be identified by a heading, well arranged, and there should be a table of contents or some form of index.
9. Scrap Books are usually made up of: pictures, newspaper clippings, special programs showing club activities and outstanding project work, club booklets, bylaws, souvenirs and etc.

SCRAP BOOKS ARE ONE MEANS OF PRESERVING FOR POSTERITY THE HISTORY, ACTIVITIES AND THE LITTLE MEMORIES OF HAPPY CLUB DAYS.

We suggest that any club having made a satisfactory and complete scrap book on the club origin or history and its activities up to date, may wish to make their second book on some special subject of interest to all club members.
