### More Action Than Talk

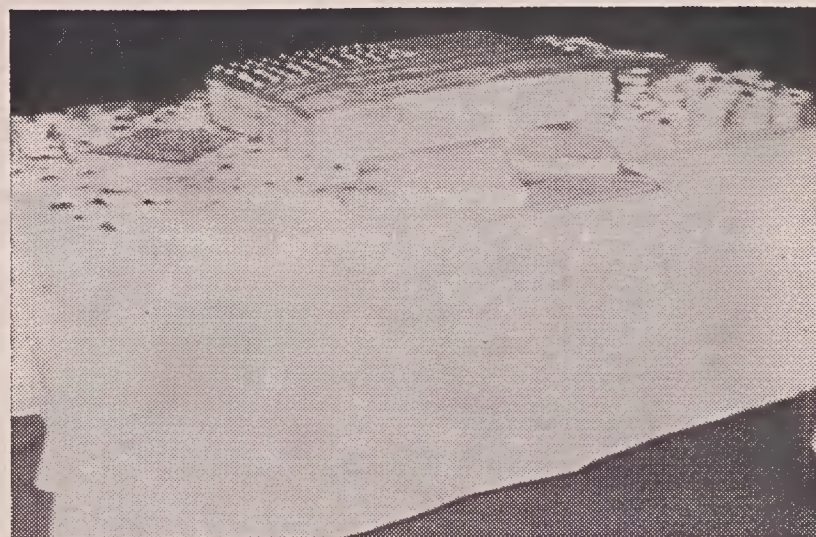

Now that your club is making plans for the year, won't you include birthday gifts for these worthy students?

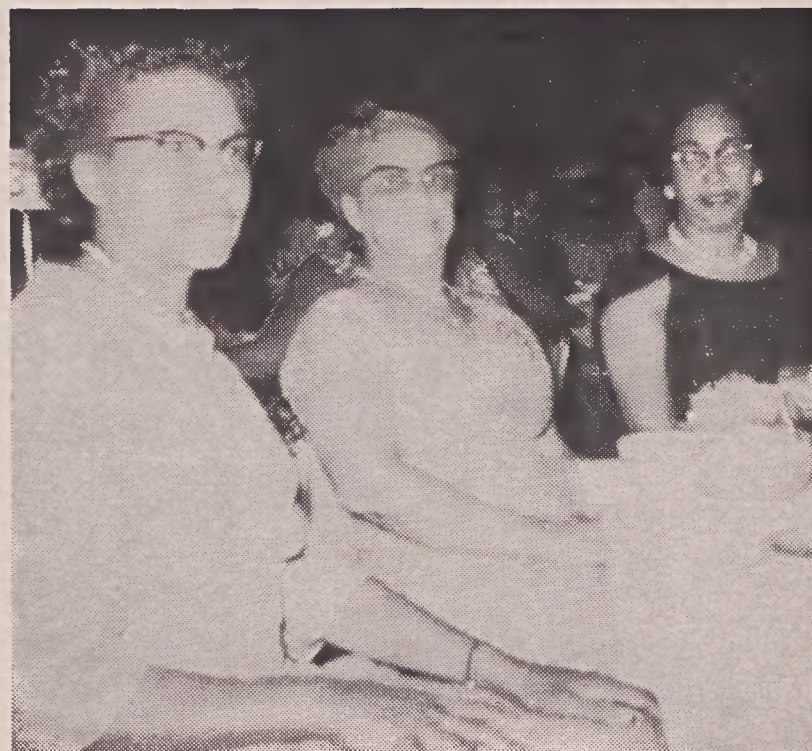
If your club doesn't meet during the summer months, please, make arrangements to take care of the gifts at this time.
