

Federated Negro Women's Clubs Holds Executive Board Meeting

Members of the Executive Board of the North Carolina Federation of Negro Women's Clubs assembled in Peebles Hotel, Raleigh, N. C. on Saturday for its fall meeting. Representatives were there from all parts of the state and transacted much business and made plans for the programs of the Federation. Mrs. M. N. Leitao, Executive Board Chairman assisted by Mrs. F. T. Newsome, State President, presided over the adult session. Mrs. Edith Johnson, Youth Director had charge of the youth division which held a separate meeting.

There was a very full agenda: A report was given by Mr. T. W. Moore, concerning the N. C. Council Leadership Workshop at State University of N. C., where she represented the federation. The president reported on the Legislative Council meeting held in the Women's Club at Raleigh, N. C. Also included in the meeting was a resume of the State Convention held at Franklinton Center, Bricks, N. C.; a resume of the Southeastern Regional Association which the State Federation entertained at the Jack Tar Hotel in Durham, N. C.; a report of the National Federation Project; the District Awards and the Youth Plans for the incoming year. Besides planning the annual budget, the following decisions were made; Retain the present name of the Federation; hold the 1968 Convention at the Fayetteville State College, June 13-15, 1968. Purchase a second Life Membership to N. A. A. C. P.; sanction the raising of National membership fees to Two dollars; place the State Scrapbook in the archives of the National Headquarters in Washington, D. C.; earmark a special project at National Headquarters; send a delegation to the Fall Forum of the N. C. Council of Women's Organizations to be held at the State University, Raleigh, N. C., October 19th; and plan a testimonial for Mrs. Esther Barnes, our retiring treasurer.
