Type Made from Paper.

Chicago News. Type made from paper is the latest novelty. A process has been patent et in En land by which large type used for placards can be made from pulp. Such letters are at present cut on word. The pulp is reduced to a powdered or comminuted state, after which it is thoroughly mixed with a wa er pro fi eg liquid or mate rial, such as a par-ffise oil or a dry-ing lin-eed oil, for in-tance. The mixture is then dried and subsequently pulverized In its pulve ized state it is introduced into a mold of the requisite construction to produce the d-sired article-type or blockand then subjected to pressure to con-olidate it and heat to render tacky or adhesive the water proofing material. Finally, the type is cooled wille in mold, so as to cause it to retain its shape and solidity.
