

are used on cottons and rayons. A dress labeled "Sanforized," "Ribmel," or "will not shrink more than 2 per cent" should not shrink out of fit.

A dress fabric that has been given special finish and labeled "crease resistant," "wash and wear," "drip dry," or "minimum care," will not shrink out of fit, either. Some names of these finishes you will find on labels are Regulated. Disciplined, Perma-Pressed, Minicare, and Wrinkl-Shed for cottons; and Avcoset for rayons.

Mercerized means that the cotton has more luster and is stronger.
