

In repeated tests, Garden Blue has been a consistant high yielder ant. of medium sized fruit. The plant ed on long fruiting shoots which make picking easier.

Garden Blue berries average 130-135 per half-pint cup. They are round, firm, blue, with good flavor and have a small dry scar. In Eastern North Carolina the fruit begins ripening in mid-June and are through ripening by mid-July.

According to Dr. Franklin E. Correll, horticultural scientist for the N. C. Agricultural Experiment Stabe well-adapted to home garden culture because of its vigorous growth and good quality fruit.

ored, large sized berries that average 95 to 100 per half-pint.

The fruit begins ripening about a week later than Garden Blue and ripens over a six to eight-week period. The plants have a medium vigor, a spreading habit of growth, and loose medium sized fruit clusters.

Dr. Correll said Menditoo is suggested for local market and home garden use because of its large fruit size and high quality.
