> Why not plant part of the crop in a disease-resistant variety which has "old-line" characteristics, and part of the crop in a disease resistant variety which does not have "old-line" characteristics?

> This would be particularly feasible, Bennett said, where a tobacco farm is tended by two or more tenants, or where a farmer has tobacco in two or more tracts.

> Disease resistant varieties that are similar in many respects to the so-called "old-line" varieties are Coker 156, S. C. 58, Oxford 1-181, Vesta 5, and Buyers' Choice. The leaf type of N.C. 73 is similar to some of the "old-line" varieties.

> Plant pathologists report that Coker 156, S. C. 58 and N. C. 73 have high levels of resistance to Black Shank. Oxford 1-181 is moderately resistant to Black Shank, while Vesta 5 and Buyers' Choice have low levels of Black Shank resistance. In addition, N. C. 73 has moderate resistance to Fusarium

> In some cases, where a suitable long rotation has been practiced and Black Shank is not too much of a problem, a variety with low level of resistance may be used. However, in the Black Shank "hot spots," a highly resistant variety, such as Coker 156, S. C. 58 and N.

As far as yields are concerned Coker 156, S. C. 58, Buyers' Choice and N. C. 73 fall in the moderate and his wife, Mary, 46, suffered yield range. Vesta 5 is a mediumhigh yielder, while Oxford 1-181 is a low yielder.

1959 Recommendations for Fertilizers Are Now Ready

The N. C. Agricultural Exten-soil test results are not available, sion Service has published its fer- however, then the Extension rectilizer recommendations for 1959 ommendations are the next best thing a farmer can use.

Copies of the recommendations may be obtained from county are based on years of study of averagents, or by writing to the Division of Agricultural Information at N. C. State college.

With one exception, the 1959 recommendations are the same as the recommendations for 1958 crops. The exception reads as follows: "For soils fumigated to control nematodes, the fertilizer for flue-cured tobacco should contain at least 25 per cent of the total nitrogen in the nitrate form."

In previous years, it was believed that one form of nitrogen was good as another for tobacco. However, recent studies have shown that, where land has been fumigated, flue-cured tobacco needed at least one-fourth of its nitrogen in nitrate form.

By applying a portion of the nirogen in nitrate form, scientists for the N. C. Agriculture Experiment Station have been able to increase tobacco yields by 10 to 20 per cent.

The fertilizer recommendations for 1959 cover about every crop grown in North Carolina. They also nclude lawns and ornaments
