C3. 1740, May 13. FURNIFOLD GREEN, JR., sells to WILLIAM THOMPSON 400 acres on the North side of NEUSE RIVER of which 300 acres on TARKILL CREEK, joining Shanawolfs; called POINT LOOKOUT, likewise 100 acres on the West side of SMITH'S CREEK, called HOLLOWING POINT, both tenements lying on the North side NEUSE RIVER. Witnesses: DANIEL SHINE and FRANCIS STRINGER. C1.

1740/41, February 11. THOMAS MARTIN sells to ABNER NEALE 170 acres on the North side of NEUSE RIVER, on the West side of ORCHARD CREEK, beginning at an oak on the end of HOGG POINT, to a gum in LONG

1741. WILLIAM WHITTY sells to JOHN PINDAR 100 acres on the North side of NEUSE RIVER, beginning gut on riverside between DAWSON'S CREEK and where VALENTINE BOWERS now lives, SAMUEL GRANBERRY'S. Witnesses: DANIEL SHINE, WILLIAM VAUGHN and WILLIAM WEBB. C1.

1742, March 17. JOHN GATLIN sells to THOMAS CARRAWAY 150 acres on the North side of NEUSE RIVER, beginning upper side of WOODWARD'S GUT, MARTIN FRANCK'S line. Witnesses: CHRISTOPHER DAWSON and JAMES MILLS. C1.

1742, February 14. GUNSTON ALLEN of Pasquotank County sells to WILLIAM BRYAN 100 acres at the head of POWELL'S CREEK, beginning at a gum at the bottom of HOLLY NECK, taken out of JOHN BIGGS' patent and known by the name of HOLLY NECK. Witnesses: JEREMIAH MURDEN and JOHN HACKSON. C1.

1742, January 6. CHARLES HOWARD sells to WALTER MORGAN 100 acres on the North side of NEUSE RIVER at the fork of LOWER BROAD CREEK, beginning at the FORK POINT, and running up BROWN'S CREEK, and the first gut called CABLES GUT, eastward to Howard Pasteur's Creek, being part of 640 acres granted to Colonel JOHN WORSLEY 23 December, 1728. Witnesses: WILLIAM CARRUTHERS and CHARLES HOWARD. C1.

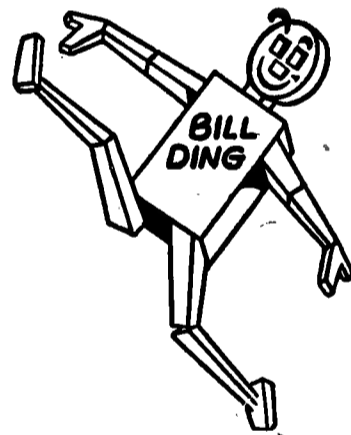
1742, September 15. JOHN CARRAWAY and wife, MARGARET, sell to JOHN WILSON 800 acres on the North side of NEUSE RIVER, on the North side of POWELL'S CREEK, called HICKORY POINT, whereon RICHARD SMITH formerly lived, patented by WILLIAM SMITH 17 April 1724, surveyed for RICHARD SMITH, deceased. Witnesses: JOHN CARNEY and THOMAS NELSON. C1.

1744. JOHN BRYAN and wife CADY BRYAN sell to LEWIS BRYAN, son of DAVID BRYAN, deceased, 130 acres on the East side of GOOSE CREEK, beginning at a Cypress at the edge of the Pocosin, to OWNE'S BRANCH. Witnesses: EDWARD BRYAN and JOHN RIGGS. C3.
