

Soybean Growers Will Have New Variety for Next Year

North Carolina soybean growers will have a new variety to choose from next year.

Hill, a new soybean variety for North Carolina and the South, has been released by USDA and cooperating state experiment stations.

Foundation seed of the new variety is now being increased. The seed supply for next year should be good, says Dr. Charles A. Brim, a USDA scientist at N. C. State college who worked on the variety.

According to George Spain, agronomy specialist at State college, the Hill has these characteristics: early maturity, high comparative yields, shatter resistance, resistance to major leaf disease and purple stain, and excellent seed quality.

Hill is similar in appearance and related to the popular Lee, Spain continued, but matures 15 to 18 days earlier. It has white instead of purple flowers, and the hilum (eye) of the seed is light brown in color. Seed size of Hill is slightly smaller than Lee.

"Hill will give soybean growers

in Northeast and Tidewater counties a choice of an earlier maturing variety," Spain says. "It may also spread the harvest season for many other growers."

Variety demonstrations of Hill are now being grown in several Eastern and Northeastern North Carolina counties. There are also plantings at the Tidewater Research Station, Plymouth.

County agricultural agents have additional information on the new variety.

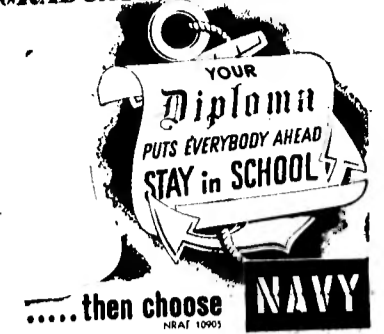

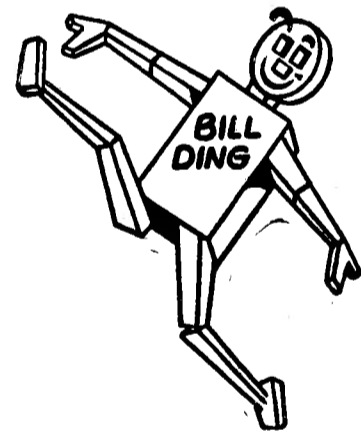

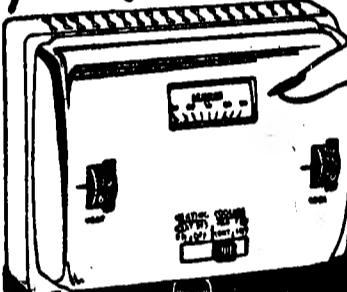
