## HOMEMAKER'S CORNER

### WHAT'S SAUCE FOR THE FISH —Is Delightful Treat for You.

Because of the great variety of fish and many methods of preparing it, the fun of preparing sauces for fish reaches its height. Here are three unusual ones.

#### Salmon Steaks with Genevoise Sauce

Place salmon steaks in preheated broiler pan. Season and brush with butter or margarine. Place pan in broiler 2 inches from heat and broil 3 minutes. Turn steaks and broil 3 to 5 minutes longer, or until fish flakes easily when tested with a fork. Serve with Genevoise Sauce.

Genevoise Sauce: Cut one carrot, and 1 onion into very fine dice and put in a saucepan with a little thyme, a small bay leaf, 3 to 4 sprigs of parsley and 1 tablespoon butter. Cook very slowly for 15 to 20 minutes, shaking the pan occasionally to prevent scorching. Cream together 1 tablespoon butter and 1 tablespoon flour and stir into pan, mixing well. Add 1 pint red wine and cook until liquid is reduced to about three-fourths the original quantity. Strain and correct the seasoning with salt. Makes enough sauce for 4 or 5 steaks.

#### Boiled Fish Steaks with Celery- Pimiento Sauce

Preheat broiler and broiler pan. Place fish steaks on pan. Brush with melted butter or margarine and sprinkle with salt, pepper and a little onion or garlic salt (if desired). Place pan 2 or 3 inches from source of heat. Broil three

minutes. Turn carefully, brush again with melted butter and repeat seasonings. Broil 5 minutes, or until fish flakes easily when tested with a fork, brushing with more melted butter once during the cooking time. Serve on heated platter with rice timbales and lemon wedges, accompanied by a bowl of Celery-Pimiento Sauce.

Celery-Pimiento Sauce: Boil 1/2 cup chopped celery until tender. Reserve 1/4 cup of water in which celery was cooked. Melt 2 tablespoons butter or margarine in saucepan. Remove from heat and blend in 1-1/2 tablespoons flour. Return to heat and add slowly 1/4 cup of celery water plus 3/4 cup milk, stirring constantly. Add 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/8 teaspoon pepper, 1/8 teaspoon thyme, 1/4 teaspoon paprika. Cook, stirring constantly until mixture begins to bubble. Add cooked celery and 1/2 cup chopped pimiento and cook just enough to be sure vegetables are heated. Makes enough sauce for four servings.
