Salmon Steaks with Genevoise Sauce

Place salmon steaks in preheated broiler pan. Season and brush with butter or margarine. Place pan in broiler 2 inches from heat and broil 3 minutes. Turn steaks and broil 3 to 5 minutes longer, or until fish flakes easily when tested with a fork. Serve with Genevoise Sauce.

Genevoise Sauce: Cut one carrot and 1 onion into very fine dice and put in a saucepan with a little thyme, a small bay leaf, 3 to 4 sprigs of parsley and 1 tablespoon butter. Cook very slowly for 15 to 20 minutes, shaking the pan occasionally to prevent scorching. Cream together 1 tablespoon butter and 1 tablespoon flour and stir into pan, mixing well. Add 1 pint red wine and cook until liquid is reduced to about three-fourths the original quantity. Strain and correct the seasoning with salt. Makes enough sauce for 4 or 5 steaks.

Boiled Fish Steaks with Celery-Pimiento Sauce

Preheat broiler and broiler pan. Place fish steaks on pan. Brush with melted butter or margarine and sprinkle with salt, pepper and a little onion or garlic salt (if desired). Place pan 2 or 3 inches from source of heat. Broil three

minutes. Turn carefully, brush again with melted butter and repeat seasonings. Broil 5 minutes. or until fish flakes easily when tested with a fork, brushing with more melted butter once during the cooking time. Serve on heated platter with rice timbales and lemon wedges, accompanied by a bowl of Celery-Pimiento Sauce.

Celery-Pimiento Sauce: Boil 1/2 cup chopped celery until tender. Reserve 1/4 cup of water in which celery was cooked. Melt 2 tablespoons butter or margarine in saucepan.
