Being invited to represent North Carolina at President-elect Kennedy's inauguration is quite a tribute for the outfit. Incidentally, the band's director is a graduate of the band.

Al Taylor, whose performances for the State College Wolfpack contributed to the Raleigh school's fine football record this season, is the son of a New Bern couple, Albert Taylor, Sr., and the former Shirley Liverman. Albert was a star halfback at New Bern High—later became a member of the State Highway Patrol.
