Excerpts from "Bits of the History of New Bern:" We are once more at the corner of East Front and Neuse streets, on the margin of Neuse River. Originally East Front and South Front streets were Neuse Front and Trent Front streets. The name of New street was changed by Die town authorities a few years ago, after strong and sensible opposition to it by the present editor of the Newbernian.

Craven streets was the home of Wil. liam Blackledge. He was a prominent citizen and member of Congress If he did do his electioneering with garden seeds, which he carried in his sulky box and distributed among the old ladies in this district, we don't know but what it was preferable to the long and windy harangues of this day to motley crowds. He had two sons, Richard and Thomas Blackledge, short time they were allowed to live, dazzled and flashed amid the bright stars around them in this town. We had at different periods two William Blackledges in Congress from this district. The other, William S. Blackledge, was a nephew.

On the opposite corner of these same streets, New and Craven, was the home of William Gaston and on New street, a few steps from the old mansion was his office. Though married three times, he was long during his life a widower. He died in Raleigh in 1844 after an attack of apoplexy on the Supreme Court bench. The "Cat Hunt" written by Alexander Gaston, only son of Judge Gaston, when he was quite young, for a Northern magazin<mark>e, was a</mark>n admirable picture of the chase.

Spaight. There he arranged many of those famous political campaigns when he opposed John Stanly, John H. Bryan and others.

Opposite on Middle street was the Stanly mansion where John Stanly resided. Nathaniel Greene, distinguished patriot, was a friend of Stanly. When in Newbern during the Revolution, though the interior of the Stanly mansion was only partially finished, Greene was in it. Two rooms were prepared there for Washington when he was in New Bern at the close of the war, but he received the people in the Palace.

In the Episcopal church grounds there is a marble slab on which is written "John Wright Stanly, died in this town in the year 1788, aged 47". John Stanly's office was on New street, not far from his dwelling.


On New street is the Presbyterian church, six of the 13 original members were: Lydia Stewart, 78 years; Dr. Elias Hawes, 71 years; Lucretia Jones, 80 years; Mrs. Eunice Hunt, 80 years; Robert Hay, 96 years; John Jones, 76 years. By adding the ages of the six together it will be found they make 480 years, or an average of 80 years.

On the corner of New and Hancock streets is the old home of a remarkable colored citizen, John C. Stanly . . . All of the history of Newbern has not yet been told. M. D. W. Stevenson, William Whit-Signed: "D".



Question Box

Q. How can I remove wrinkles from the skin?

A. Apply once or twice a day a mixture of one ounce of melted white wax, two ounces of strained honey, and two ounces of juice of lily bulbs. Get the approval of your physician or druggist before using.

Q. How can I remove glue stains from furniture and fabrics?

A. By dipping a cloth in vinegar and rubbing hard. If the glue has hardened, keep wetting it with vinegar, and when softened rub it off.

Q. How can I mend a rubber het water bottle?

A. By using several layers of mending tissue, setting in place with a warm iron.

Q. How can I clean the inside of

a glass jar? A. Fill it with hot water and stir

a teaspoonful of baking soda in it. Shake well, then empty the jar at once and rinse in clear water.
