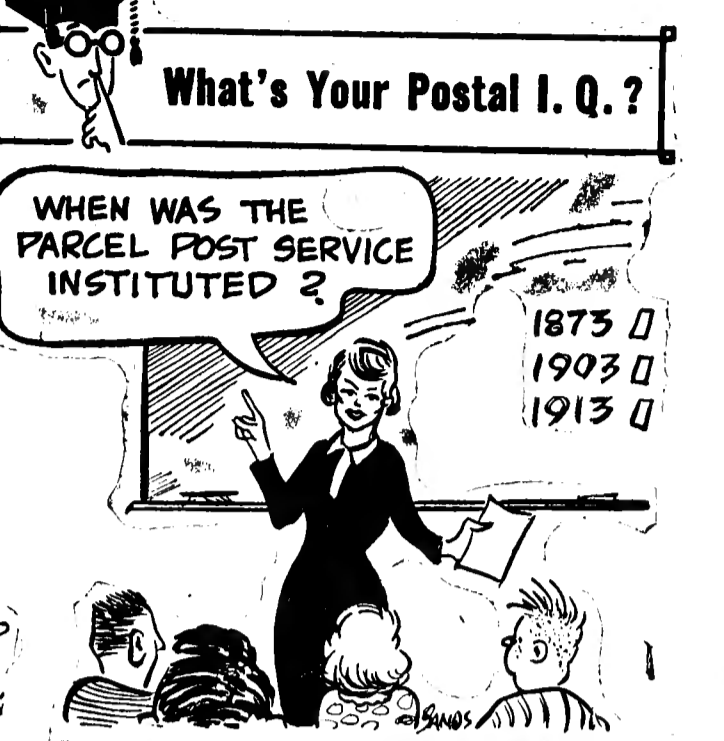

Tips From New Bern's Post Office



1. The Parcel Post Service was instituted in 1913. It has proved to be one of the most widely used services and has facilitated the exchange of farm products and goods between the rural and urban areas. The Post Office Department now handles more than one billion pieces of parcel post annually. Insurance and Collect on Delivery Parcel Post services were also instituted during 1913.

2. TRUE—Box rent may be paid annually or quarterly at the option of the boxholder. A patron renting a box on an annual basis who surrenders the box before the end of the fiscal year for which rent has been paid may apply for a refund of that portion of the box rent that is applicable to all full quarters remaining in the fiscal year. No refund may be made for the remaining portion of the quarter in which the box is surrendered.

Important Notice LIST YOUR 1962 TAXES IN JANUARY

The tax lists for the respective townships will be prepared to receive your tax lists beginning January 2, 1962. Failure to list during the month of January subjects the taxpayer to indictment, as well as the imposition by law of a heavy penalty.

To avoid the rush and standing-in-line, of the last days of the month, see your list taker during the early days of the month when you will have the necessary time to properly list your property rather than wait until the list taker is crowded for time by the waiting late listers.

Farmers are requested by law to give information for the farm census, thus making it necessary for them to know the number of acres planted in different kinds of crops during the year of 1961, the number and kind of livestock, poultry, etc., as of January 1, 1962.

All Automobiles & Trucks must be listed. These listings will be checked against the State Registrations. If you fail to list, and your car is listed from the State Registration you will be charged penalty for late listing. Be sure to bring a list of all your cars, trucks, trailers, tractors, etc., showing make, model, serial numbers, etc. All be sure to list all dogs.
