Nichols feels that North Carolina

Mrs. Edith McGlamery, home development specialist for the N. C. Agricultural Extension Service, says tier curtains came along with the shorted windows used in new fabrics, in solids and prints, east coasts of Maryland, Delaware house construction, but they're adaptable and equally effective in older houses with big windows.

There are short-shorts, to be hung inside the window frame in one or more tiers.

Tier curtains are usually of sheer fabrics, ruffled at the bottom. This ruffle may be single, double or triple. (Multiple ruffles of Dacron are no problem to keep looking fresh).

Tier curtains are available in allplain fabrics but are most often made of a combination of fabrics such as polished cotton trim on Dacron. And new this season is the tailored tier curtain, hung on a rod with ruffles.

Mrs. McGlamery says cafe curtains are closely related to tier

Cafe curtains which hang on a tubular rod by sliding metal rings or fabric loops attached at the top are usually made of opaque

"Some styles are reversible for quick-change decorating without additional expense," she adds. "The 30 to 45 inch cafes are hung singly or in tiers, depending on window height or effect desired."
