Read Romans 5:12-21 Where sin abounded, grace did much more abound. (Romans 5:20.)

While doing an intricate piece of embroidery, I made a mis-take early in the work because I had not followed instructions carefully. I undid the work; but even though I was rid of the wrong stitches, holes were left in the linen.

Now is the time to drink lots of milk, to use creamy cottage cheese in spring salads, and to serve ice cream as a refreshing dessert. Milk supplies are expected to be higher this year.
