

Yogi couldn't be surer of a place in baseball's Hall of Fame at Cooperstown if the selections were rigged in his behalf. Who else has played in 74 World Series games, made 71 hits, and batted in 39 runs? He has accepted more fielding chances than any catcher in World Series history.
