March Term 1791. Joseph Crispin prays he have leave to build a saw and grist mill on Durham's Creek, 1/4 mile from the mouth thereof.

June 18, 1791. Commissioners to lay off and value land on NS of Broad Creek on Charles Churchill's land, Levi Dawson, Charles Williams, James Gatlin, Wm. Speight. Philip Knowls owns land on opposite side.

March Term 1796, Petition of Samuel Chapman to build mill
