My friends, this is a government we are doing business with. Negotiating for a peaceco-existence. Yet every treaty they have ever made, they have sabotaged at their own convenience. Should we continue to sit down around the table with Satan?

On this important question, there arise two points of view. (1) The duty of the Christian Church. (2). The job of a Christian Nation. The church should make every effort to adhere to the teachings of Jesus; "My Kingdom is not of this world-else my servants would fight."
