



New Bern parents--watching the transfer of President Kennedy's flag-draped casket from the White House to the Capitol last Sunday--won't soon forget the sight of an unbelievably brave widow, flanked by her five year old daughter and three year old son.

Perhaps the son, because of merciful incomprehension in keeping with his age, suffered a minimum anguish as he stood in the Capitol rotunda. Not so for little Carolyn, who adored her father. The tragic solemnity of the occasion wasn't lost on her.

Millions of tears must have been shed in a single instant by television viewers from coast to coast when the child and her mother knelt at the casket, and tenderly kissed the Stars and Stripes that covered it. One need not be a parent to share in a deep personal sense the heartbreak that was theirs.

In the nation's great grief over the loss of its young and vigorous Chief Executive, and its sympathy for his family, two other families were all but forgotten at the moment. In Dallas, the wife and children of a policeman slain on the day of the President's assassination were in deep sorrow too.

Like the children of the president, the children of this officer who died in line of duty have been robbed by violence of a relative near and dear to them. And the policeman's widow, in her virtual obscurity, has much in common at such a time as this with Jackie Kennedy.

Tragic too is the future in store for the two children of Lee Oswald, who according to circumstantial evidence that appears to be overwhelmingly conclusive, was the assassin. They, and his Russian-born widow, will carry a cruel stigma to their graves.
