winter, and spray them after pruning. Muscadine grapes may be cut back--all the growth from last spring.

Make candle boards and Della Robbias for Christmas gifts. These may be made up in advance. Use some artificial fruits to give color and shape to the wreath.

Cones and drift wood are nice gifts. Gather some of these for colors in the fireplace. Toproduce certain colors of flame, add the following: yellow-sodium chloride salt and potassium nitrate; red--lithium chloride and stontarium nitrate; green--copper nitrate; blue-copper sulphate; orange--cal-cium chloride; violet--potassium chloride.

You may also buy prepared drift-wood crystals. Gather cones, put on a little glue or shellac and sprinkle with chemicals. Let them dry and pack in cellophane bags. Tie with colored ribbons.

Do not put poinsettias in a draft. They drop their leaves when exposed to much change in room temperature. Cut poinsettias do well each time the stem is cut. Seal it by placing it over a flame.

Send gifts of evergreens to the friends who haven't anyway of cutting them.


