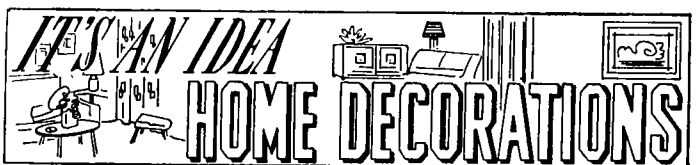

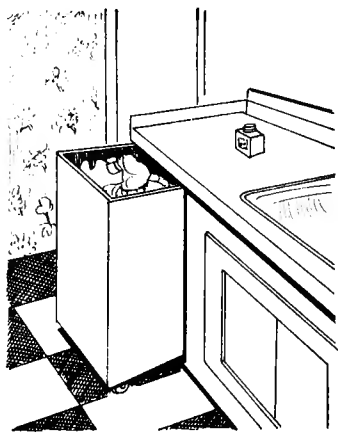

Most bathrooms do not contain closet space for soiled clothing. Where room is available, the homemaker can install a container for soiled clothing beneath a counter top, as illustrated. It will be easier to train children to deposit soiled clothing here, since they do not have to leave the bathroom. Wheels on the cart are a big help, and permit cart to be rolled directly to the laundry center.
