The glory of the garden is lilies. Nothing gives a garden the grace and elegance that a lily does. Most of them germinate slowly. Sometimes they

wait until the second spring to come up.

Many take from only three to six weeks to sprout. Auratum, Gold-Banded, Martagon, Turban, Rubellum, and folum are some that you may plant the seed of now.

Buy your pansies, violas and English daisy seed now. The plants will be ready to transplant in late spring.

Nothing surpasses delphiniums as a spike flower for spring. Freeze the seed and plant them in good, moist malleable loam. Well rotted manure should be added at least twice a year. Delphiniums will grow to six feet under good conditions. Most of them come in pretty blues and violet.

Single and double larkspur are annuals for decoration and for cutting. These too grow on long stems. The colors are from pure white to royal purple.

They are easy to grow, and like to be planted in a sunny bed.

Get a collection of Dutch irises. They are good mixed with plants that have a lot of foliage.

Plant Dog's-Tooth violets with tulips and daffodils.

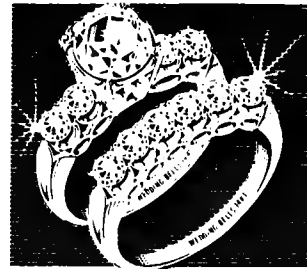
