Nuts, pods, burrs and branches should be painted, shellaced, or dried for Christmas. Prepare them and store in a place where you may get them easily. They also make thoughtful gifts

Plan the birds' diet for the winter. Put feeders where the birds can get to them easily, and where it is easy for you to get to. Make bird crumbs, mutton suet cakes, and fill pine cones with suet before you actually need them.

Plant or replant all shrubbery before the ground freezes. Cut dead limbs from trees. It is a good season to dig up the soil for after Christmas planting. Turn the grass under and let it decay before planting.

When was the last time you had waffles at your house? You can get them conveniently packaged at almost any store now, and some of the ones we've tried are quite tasty. Just put them in your toaster, and in a few moments you're on your way.

Try this recipe for peanut butter chiffon pie. If you don't fancy it, the kids will eat your share.

You'll need 1 envelope of plain gelatin; 1 cup of cold water; 2 egg yolks, well beaten; 1/4 cup of sugar or light corn syrup; 1/2 teaspoon of salt; 1/2 cup of peanut butter; 2 egg whites; 1/2 teaspoon of vanilla; 19-inch baked pie shell.

Soften gelatin in 1/4 cup of cold water. Blend egg yolks, 1/2 of the sugar, 1/4 cup of water, and salt in the top of a double boiler. Beat with a rotary

beater until thick and fluffy. Cool.

Place the peanut butter in bowl, add remaining water gradually, beating until smooth. Add egg mixture and vanilla, blend with beater. Chill until slightly thickened. Beat whites until foamy--add remaining sugar, beating until stiff.

Fold in chilled mixture. Turn into pie shell (or crumb crust) and chill. Top with sweetened whipped cream and chopped nuts.

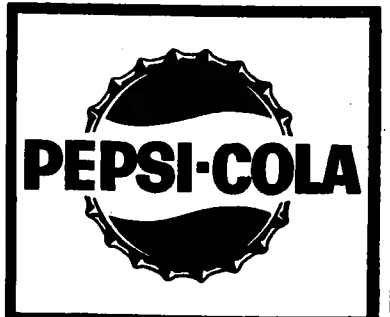
