Make the hole to put the lilac in large enough to spread all the roots out. Place some rotted manure or leaf mold to cause roots to go deeper.

Always plant lilacs deeper than they grew in the nursery. Pack good soil around them, and keep them plenty moist. Lilacs like bone meal.

GRASS: Rub with lard or oil and wash in hot suds. Bleach and remaining stain with diluted household bleach.

LIPSTICK AND ROUGE; Sponge with safe dry cleaning fluid for heavy stain, then brush with detergent solution and launder.
