Encourage the children to keep a travel diary, and provide each child with a map so he can trace the route.

Bring along lots of fresh and dried fruits, bring a thermos of ice water and a supply of paper cups. Keep insect repellent handy. Keep a damp cloth in the glove compartment. (Wrap it in aluminum foil.)

Don't drive after dark. Give the kids a chance to play or swim for an hour before dinner and bedtime. Don't let them play with door handles or locks, and don't let them be a litter-


