


The work for paisleys is-bold. Look for strong colors and designs that range from tiny geometrics to enormousinterwinding patterns.


Here's why just the use of a soft, clean cloth is good. If you have new wood furniture, chances are it already has a good, hard finish so only a regular dusting off is all these pieces need.

If you possess antique furniture or fine, old pieces of wood furniture, you can actual-ly safeguard the finish better by dusting the surface with a clean cloth rather than adding on layers of cleaners or polishes. What happens when you are over-generous with polishes or waxes is this: they build up on the surface of the furniture; actually attract more dust and may leave gummy, solled surfaces on your wood furniture. Also the "antiqued look" given to some items may furniture be destoyed by over-zealous cleaning and polishing. You'll still wish to keep a clean surface on your furni-

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ture. So when the wood takes on a dull, soiled look, wash it gently but quickly with suds made of a light duty deter-
