## Washington Report

Last week the principal Items of interest in Washington concerned the military. First, was the generally approvedaction of Secretary Stanley R.
Resor of the Department of the Army in announcing that there will be no prosecution of the Green Berets in connection with the disappearance of a Vietnamese counter-spy. I am convinced that this action was a result of Congressional protest over 40,000 American us. With ed in action--no doubt many of them as a result of enemy es-pionage--it was inconcelvable that criminal prosecution could have been justified in the case of these young men, acting in what they considered to be the best interest of the security of this nation.
Another military matter was the House approval of the procraft, missiles, naval vor airand tracked combat vehicles for the Fiscal Year 1970. This authorization was for a total of $\$ 21.3$ billion. It is important to understand that this is still an authorization and remains to be approved by the Appropriations Committee, as well as requiring House consideration of the Appropriations Committee's action.
This year the Congress has conducted a wider discussion tion of the defense budget than ever before. And this is as it should be, for with the anticipated total appropriation for national defense for Fiscal Year 1970 amounting to in excess of $\$ 75$ billion, it is incumbent on the Congress to analyze carefully the justification of these requests. In addition, these discussions provide a more detailed explanation to the public al large. the public is the news media, the public is giving and knowledge of what exactly is involved in defending this country and in keeping our commiltments with free nations throughout the world.
Representative L. Mendel Rivers, Chairman of the Armed Services Commiltee, had this to say: "World leadership is a tough business. America has assumed this role of not forfelt it. We just cannot forfeit this leadership. We are the only ones who canhandle it, so now let us handle it."
The House considered the military procurement authori zation for three days, while by theSenate took $2-1 / 2$ months. by the Senate took $2-1 / 2$ months.
The House approved version was $\$ 1.8$ billion less than the request made by former Secretary Clifford in January, and $\$ 663$ million less than the amount requested by Defense Secretary Laird on April 15.
H. R. 13300 was a blll to amend the Rallroad Retirement Act of 1937 to accomplish mandatory retirement and the extension of supplemental annulties. This blll was a result of an agreement between over $80 \%$ of the membership of the unions involved and the management of rallroads. In spite of this, most members of Congress were flooded with lons urging the defeat of this bill. Apparently these union leaders were unaware that this legislation was necessary to validate any sort of an agreement, because the Federal Government, through previous Congressional action, 15 the administrator of this retirenient svstem.
