how it turned out left little cause for regret. Great though he undoubtedly is, Pete probably wouldn't have been given a free rein by some other coach, and, forced to perform more as a team man he couldn't have scored as often.

Few ball clubs can make it, if they depend too heavily on a single star. The presence of young Maravich on the LSU team for three exciting years wasn't enough to bring the Bengals a Southeastern Conference crown, much less the opportunity to assert themselves in NCAA competition.

This had to be keenly disappointing to Pistol Pete and his father. Worse still, when LSU accepted a bid to the National Invitational in New York's Madison Square Garden, Pete's performances before two yielding an ailing ankle were
