Last week Congress was still in the election recess. Of course the Election Day of November 3 was the main topic of interest throughout the nation last week.


On the national level there were many surprises with both the Democratic and the Republican Parties claiming victories. My own analysis is that on the national level the results were not too conclusive

### "ZOOM" PUTS YOU

Amateur and home movie buffs can learn a lot from the professional movie photographers, even without taking a course in cinema.

For instance, many home movies become dull because all scenes and sequences are shot from the same distance and perspective. There is neither varie-

ty nor impact.

Next time you watch a movie in a theater or on television, pay attention to how the camera is used. One classic technique, for instance, is to begin with a long range "establishing" shot, then move to a "me-dium shot" which zeroes in on the subject, and then to

a dramatic close-up. You can do the same, and one thing that makes it easy is the newer "zoom" lens, which makes it easy to go smoothly from "establishing" shots all the way in to effective close-ups.

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
