(Continued from page 1) United States of America." Such a treaty of peace was never signed.

The bills carried a wide variety of illustration. Yours may have pictured Confederate President Jefferson Davis, Vice-President Alexander H. Stephens, or a couple of cabinet members, Judah P. Benjamin and R. M. T. Hunter. And it's also possible that the engraving features a likeness of George Washington, Andrew Jackson, John C. Calhoun, Ceres (goddess of vegetation), some other mythological character, or a cotton field.

Following the War Between the States, there were thousands of Confederate "Blue Backs" scattered in home and businesses around New Bern. How many remain in existence is anybody's guess. Because they were plentiful, and worthless, many of them were dicarded during the bitter Reconstruction days, and others were simply misplaced and lost with the passing of years

If there's a moral to this, it's the inevitable fact that almost everything becomes valuable when kept long enough to become a scarce item. For example, countless old lettters have been thrown away here that carried stamps and considered priceless today. Maybe you didn't toss them in t**ra**sh the during housecleaning session, but if you didn't, your parents or




