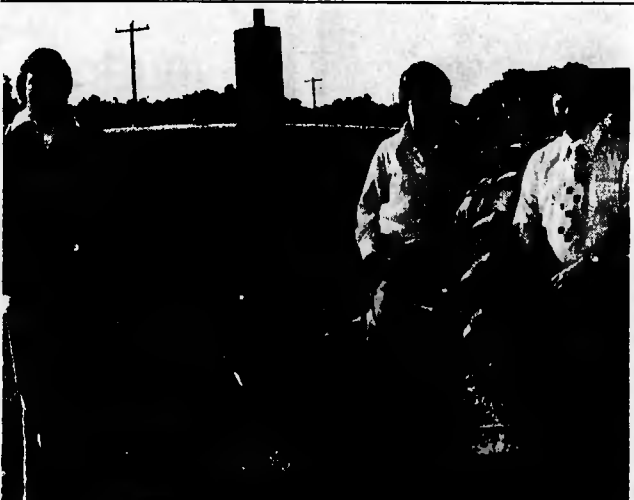
Epworth congregation gathers to dedicate new memorial steeple.
