Should pregnant women drink coffee? - T.M.

A recently published study from the National Coffee Association shows that the equivalent of four cups of coffee daily can cause birth defects in rats. Similar studies detected other reproductive problems in mice and rabbits. According to Michael Jacobson, director of the Center For Science In The Public Interest: There is ample evidence that caffeine interferes with mammalian reproduction and may cause birth defects, miscarriages and infertility in humans.'

I've heard that part of the treatment for psoriasis sufferers is to go into a special closet. Can you tell me more about this? - B.H.

The closet is lined with ultraviolet lights and is called Houva-Lite. Studies indicate that this closet, when combined with a drug called 8 methoxypsoralen taken 2 to 3 hours prior to closet entry, clears up psoriasis in 85 percent of the cases.

Is skim milk cow's milk) for infants? — C.M.

Because of its low cost, skim milk is attractive for stretching the food budget. Even when fortified with vitamins A and D, it does not meet current recommendations because of inadequate calories from fat, absent essential fatty acids, absent vitamin C, excessive protein, excessive electrolytes and absent vitamin E. When it comes to infant feeding, do not change anything without consulting with your physician.

CHEAP HEAT

A fireplace is a cheery

thing on a cold winter's evening, but the sad truth is that it's inefficient about 90 percent of the heat is lost up the chimney, taking with it warm air from the room. A fireplace can actually increase your overall heating costs.

Today a good many people are using an alternawood-burning stove. Unlike a fireplace, a stove is 50 percent efficient, and with wise use will permit you to turn off the furnace for long periods.

What you have to determine is, will the cost of the stove and its installation, plus the cost of the wood you burn, add up to less than the cost of running your furnace? You can buy a stove for as little as \$100, but it may not be of solid, airtight construcion. The stove and connecting pipes get very hot and the fire hazard is always there; you'll be wise to invest around \$300 for a well-made stove, have it installed by an expert and inspected by a
