Enrollment Up

Enrollment in colleges and universities is on the increase over last year, if preliminary figures prove correct. According to early estimates, campus enrollment for the current academic year stands at about 11.6 million — a jump of an estimated 300,000 students.

National Center for Education Statistics officials pointed out recently that last June the number of 18-year-olds graduating from high schools in the United States had "peaked." As a result, the number of high school graduates is expected to decline into the 1980's.

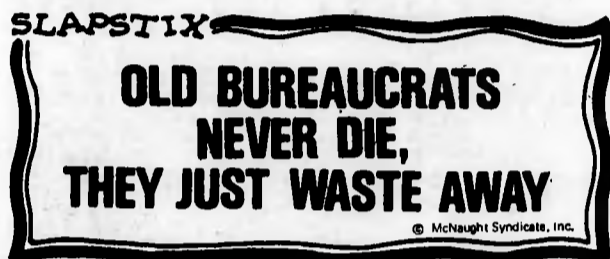
campuses across the country, meanwhile, disclosed some new trends in college this year, including:

—A potential swing back away from career training to a demand for more general college education.

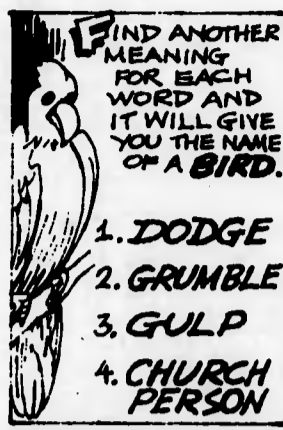
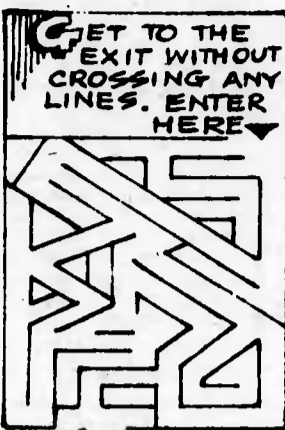
—Students are asking for larger financial aid packages but the number of requests has not risen significantly.

—The proportion of women in college classes seems to have stabilized at almost 49 per cent — up from 41 per cent in 1970.

—Part-time enrollment has jumped to 40 per cent last fall from a figure of 32 per cent eight years ago.

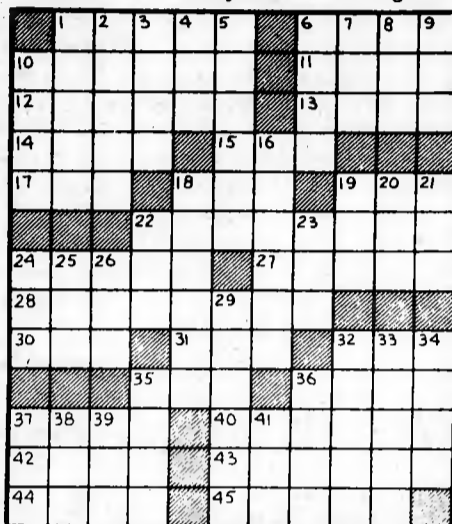
