County Board adopts specs

#### New Vanceboro School one step closer By Connie Bryan

At their meeting on February 21, the Craven County Board of Education adopted the educational specifications for a new elementary school in the Vanceboro area. Miss Ruth Hoyle, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculm, presented the plans, saying that she felt that these specifications "reflect the needs of students faculty, and community.'

These plans are just the first in a long series of steps which must be taken before the new school becomes a reality. The first step of course is to secure the funds needed for construction. The board voted to ask the Craven County Commissioners for one million dollars over a three year period. This means that is will be 1983 before construction begins. The

board agreed to provide an additional million dollars from the county's surplus capital in the Unexpended

These specifications call for a 56,000 sq. ft. complex with 7 pods of 4 rooms each. If these specifications are implemented as they are, the building will include a media center for instructional materials, such as, films, television, and books; a resource area for special education and remedial reading students; and a cultural arts center for music and art education. In other action the board agreed to accept a bid from Stadiums Unlimited for aluminum bleachers at West Craven and Havelock Junior High Schools. The bleachers will cost about \$10,000.
