Leadership Development For Women

Actress-singer Polly Bergen, television newswoman Jessica Savitch, Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm and South Carolina's Lt. Gov. Nancy Stevenson will join Gov. Jim Hunt on the program of the Governor's Conference on Leadership Development for Women planned for March 11-12 in Raleigh.

Approximately 1,000 women from throughout the state are expected to attend the conference in the Raleigh Civic Center. The Conference, entitled the "The Future Agenda," is a follow-up to the previous statewide conference held in 1978, to nine regional conferences, and to 100 county conferences which are to be completed by the March conference.

The conferences, convened by Gov. Hunt to provide leadership development opportunities for North Carolina women, have attracted more than 15,000 participants.

Gov. Hunt will open the conference at 10 a.m., March 11, and will be followed by Jessica Savitch at the 1 p.m. luncheon and Shirley Chisholm at the 7 p.m. banquet. "Tamsen Donner," a drama presentation by the Carolina Regional Theatre, will be performed at the banquet in observance of Women's History Week.

Lt. Gov. Nancy Stevenson is scheduled to speak at 11 a.m., March 12, and Polly Bergen, at the 12:15 p.m. luncheon.

Mrs. Juanita Bryant is executive director of the leadership program in the Council on the Status of Women in the N.C. Department of Administration and is conference coordinator.

"This conference marks an end and a beginning," Mrs. Bryant said. "It celebrates the successful conclusion of local leadership conferences in each county and region in the state, and it focuses attention on the 'future agenda' and on further political, personal and economic development of women."
