"The Hiding Place" written by Carrie Ten Beem is coming in April.

"The Hiding Place" starring Julie Harris/Eileen Heckart/Arthur O'Connell and introducing Jeanett Clift is based on the best-seller by Carrie Ten Beem with John and Elizabeth Sherrill.

The bride is a graduate of East Carolina University, Greenville.

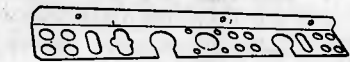
The bridegroom is associated with Lewis Logging, New Bern.

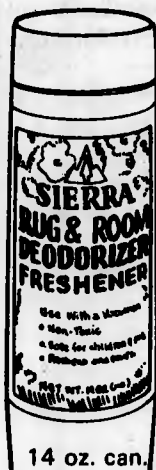
