### Tips on Canning With Water Bath

Any large metal container may be used as a boiling water bath canner.

It must be deep enough, however, for water to cover the tops of the jars by at least one inch.

Other points to look for in your container are a tight-fitting cover and a wire rack to hold jars off the bottom of the kettle. This will allow water to circulate freely and prevent jar breakage.

If you already have a steam pressure canner, you may use it as a boiling water bath canner providing it is deep enough.

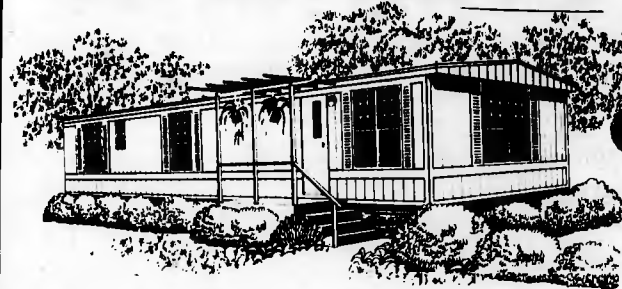
Remember, however, that if you use the steam pressure canner you can cover it but do not fasten the lid. And be sure to leave the petcock or vent wide open to allow steam to escape.
