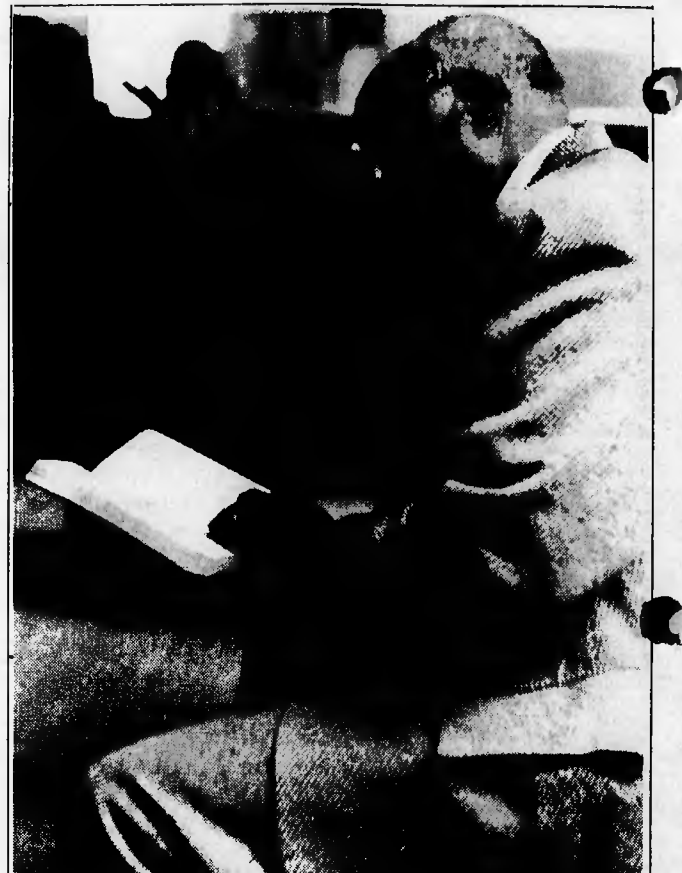
Presentation of gifts to the seniors has been a special occasion at the Vanceboro Christian Church for several years.
