LCC Cheerleader Coach

KINSTON—Mrs. Edna S. Denton of Fort Barnwell, cheerleader coach at Lenoir Community College, has announced her selections for the 1982-83 Cheerleaders at LCC. The seven-member team includes one alternate, and it has already been drilled for the basketball season that opens at Chapel Hill November 30, according to Athletic Director Pete D. Barnes.

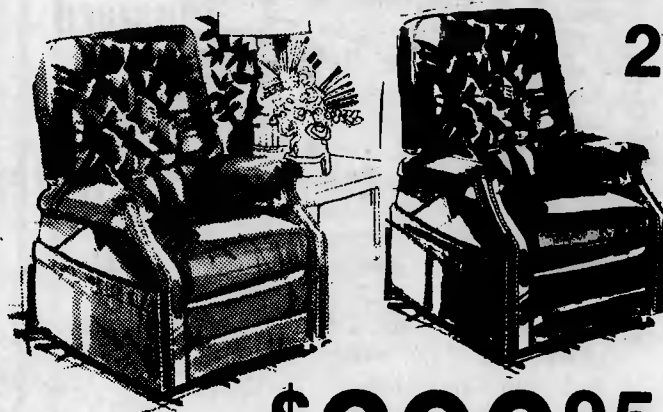
