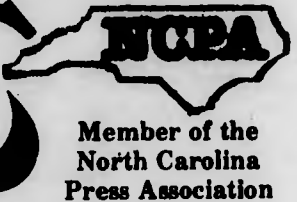

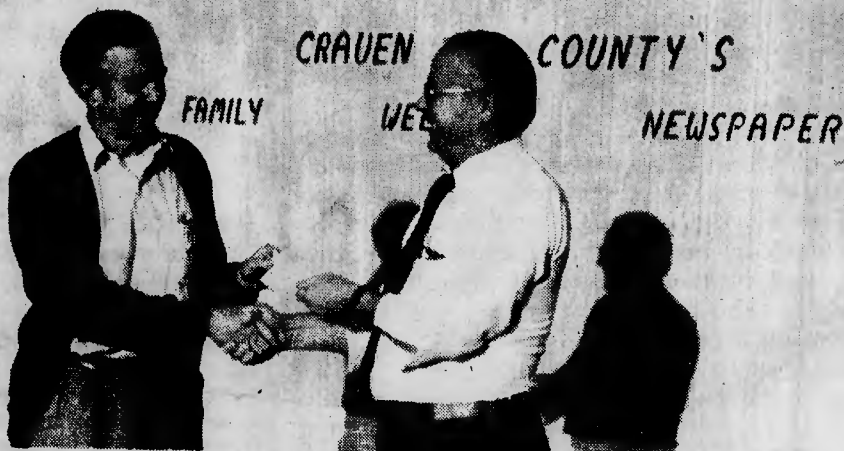
The Andersons have sixteen grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.
