## Cannon Speaks To Rotary

To enlighten the local Vanceboro Rotary Club Richard Cannon, publisher of the *Highlights* newspaper gave the Rotarians a talk concerning the need for a community newspaper and some of the problems faced in publishing a weekly.

He stated that all growing communities are in need of an instrument to share the work of the community and its progress or lack of progress.

Cannon stated news is always hard to get and people should be more willing to share their success and their progress. Rotarians were encouraged to aid the newspaper when ever possible with their support.

Cannon explained the new format of the paper. Like 90 percent of all newspapers in the country, the *Highlights* has a new format. The newspaper is five columns wide and thirteen inches deep. This, according to Cannon, is the third major change experienced by the newspaper. This format will have wider columns and should be easier to read.
