Thawing Food

There are quite a few frozen foods that may cause food poisoning if thawed at room temperature.

Among the potential problem foods — meat, fish, poultry, combination main dishes, cream sauces, meringues, cream pies, and foods that contain these ingredients.

Because the outer edges thaw rapidly, any bacteria there will begin to grow even while the central portions of the food are still thawing. And two- to three-hours of bacterial growth can make these foods capable of causing illness.

First—you can thaw the frozen food in the refrigerator. The amount of thawing time needed will vary with the food and the size of the package.

An alternative is to wrap the food in plastic and place it under cold running water. Or you can take the plastic-wrapped food and immerse it in cold water, changing the water often.

Your third choice is to cook the food in the frozen state. Cooking time will be one-and-a-half times longer than if you were cooking the same food already thawed.

Of course there are some frozen foods that can be thawed safely at room temperature. They include frozen breads, cookies, cakes and fruits and vegetables without sauce.
