### Wachovia's **Net Income** Increases

The Wachovia Corporation's net income per share for the second quarter of 1984 was \$1.47, an increase of 15.8 percent over the \$1.27 earned in the same period last year. This amounted to \$23.737 million compared with \$20,402 million a year earlier, according to John G. Medlin Jr., chief executive officer.

For the first six months, net income was \$2.98 per share, a 12.3 percent increase over th \$2.65 in the prior year half. This represented \$48.070 million compared with \$42.614 million earned in 1983.

Income before securities transactions were \$1.55 per share, up 14 percent from the second three months of 1983. For the first half, it totaled \$3.12 per share, up 13.6 percent over a year ago. This was equivalent to \$25.123 million for the quarter and \$50.415 million for the half.

Medlin said higher levels of commercial and consumer loans, net interest income and other operating revenues were primarily responsible for the strong performance in both periods.

Average loans were up \$712 million or 19.8 percent for the quarter and \$551 million or 15.5 percent for the half over 1983 levels. Taxable equivalent net interest income advanced \$10.447 million or 13.5 percent from the 1983 second quarter and \$16.154 million or 10.4 percent for the half.
