> Beaufort County lines. The department was incorporated in October 1959 and that week the group announced the purchase of a \$11,400 fire truck from W.S. Darley Company in Chicago. The chassis for the fire truck was purchased from Whitford Motor, Inc. and was to be delivered to Chicago for outfitting. A second piece of equipment was a tanker truck which had been secured by Principal E. P. Blair of the Vanceboro Schools. The county gave it to the town, and the town gave it to the department. The estimated water available on the two trucks was 2,500 gallons.
