Junior Achievement

Junior Achievement has come to Craven County through the aid and financial assistance of Weyerhaeuser, Stanadyne, Hatteras, Carolina Power and Light, Wachovia, Carolina Telephone and the work of local business people and organization. They have helped to make JA a reality for sophomores, juniors, and seniors in Craven County.

Junior Achievement is a nonprofit organization financed by individuals and businesses. The purpose of JA is to provide jr. high and high school students with practical business experience and anunderstanding of the principles of the free enterprise system. These students learn about the American economic system by actually founding, operating and then liquidating their own companies. These companies go through a complete business life cycle. The process involves such activities as selling stocks, electing officers, choosing a product, noting, and selling the product, publishing the annual report noting, and selling the product, publishing the annual report and more. JA also offers awards and scholarships to outstanding members of the organization.

The program roughly parallels the school year. The student companies meet one night a week for two hours under the guidance of adult volunteers called advisors who come from local businesses and organizations. JA is recruiting students through West Craven and New Bern High School.

University Scholar Award

The family of Helen McLawhorn has endowed one of the new University Scholars Awards announced recently at East Carolina University. the fall of 1985.

Under the umbrella of the University Scholars program, the \$3,000 scholarship will be awarded annually for the entire four years of a recipient's undergraduate education. Regional screening committees will review applications and invite regional finalists for personal interviews. The top
