Honors students who wish to continue in honors-level programs of study during their junior and senior years participate in specific honors courses sponsored by the departments of their individual major fields of study.

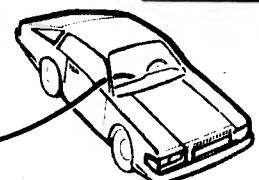
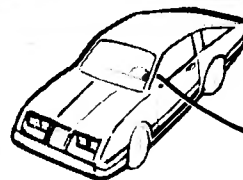
