Bishop Penick Will Present Diplomas in Chapel Monday

Saint Mary's one hundred and third annual commencement begins tonight with the presentation of *As You Like It* by the Dramatic Club under the direction of Miss Florence C. Davis.

The entire student body will assemble on Saturday morning at eight-thirty in order to practice for the commencement procession on Monday. Sophomore Class Day will begin at eleven o'clock on the front campus with the class procession from Smedes. Sarah Bain, president of the sophomore class, will welcome the guests; this is followed by the class singing the Alma Mater. Caroline McGuirk will read the class roll, after which Marietta Duke will give the class prophecy. Frankie Shamburger will present the Ideal Saint Mary's Girl, followed by Martha Conger reading the Last Will and Testament. Mrs. Cruikshank will present the award to the sophomore with the highest scholastic average. After the presentation of the class gift by Sarah Bain, Jean Rickenbaker will accompany the class song. The Rev. Mr. I. Harding Hughes, chaplain, will pronounce the closing benediction.

The Alumnae Association will meet in the Hut at two-thirty on Saturday afternoon, followed by Senior Class Day exercises in the Auditorium at four o'clock.
